Critics say her playing brings a "young (Martha) Argerich" to mind, and when Russian concert pianist Sofya Gulyak performed in the Bay Area in 2015, the audience agreed – she was thrilling.

The radiant and talented Gulyak will close the 22nd season of Steinway Society – The Bay Area season in two concerts May 6 and May 7. On May 6 she performs at an in-home fundraising recital and on May 7 a matinee concert at Trianon Theatre.

Since appearing here in 2015, her reputation has continued to shine and grow. A native of Kazan (Russia) she brings depth, emotion and insights into her playing. She has been praised for her "tremendous precision and colouration...exquisite soft playing ...with delicacy" and described as a "Rach star" (Washington Post).

In 2009 she took home the Gold Medal at the Sixteenth Leeds International Piano Competition, the first woman in the history of the competition to achieve this distinction. Since then she has appeared in great halls around the world and, in addition to touring, is currently a professor of piano at the Royal College of Music in London. At William Kapell International Piano Competition, where she took first place and the Audience Award, the chairman of judges said, "she had a way of expressing what she wanted to say in the clearest, most immediate way."

Her recordings (2013, 2015) have launched to critical and popular praise, The American Record Guide writing, "...Not only does she perform with arresting contrast and lovely, soft floating tone. She keeps you on the edge of your seat, as the music presses ever forward. Sometimes I was reminded of the young Argerich."
